Nashville Young Enterprising Women Mentoring Forum connects businesswomen, teen girls

NASHVILLE, TN — 100 young women from five Nashville area high schools had an opportunity to meet and learn from more than 20 women business leaders at the 5th annual Nashville Young Enterprising Women Mentoring Forum hosted last week at the headquarters of AllianceBernstein in downtown Nashville.

The event was presented by the Enterprising Women Foundation and the Institute for Consumer Money Management and hosted by Sharon W. Reynolds, President and CEO of DevMar Products. Through the forum, female students from Cane Ridge, Glencliff, Maplewood, Pearl-Cohn and Whites Creek high schools participated in an interactive session on managing their finances, heard from a panel of Nashville women business leaders, and engaged in mentorship discussions.

Monica Smiley, president and founder of Enterprising Women Foundation and editor and publisher of Enterprising Women magazine welcomed the girls and introduced the program. Nashville was one of 17 cities selected to participate in this national program to encourage more young women to consider a career in a STEM field and plant the seeds of entrepreneurship.

Five years ago, when Reynolds created the Nashville Y.E.W. Forum, the event served 20 girls from one school. It has grown each year, and this year's group of 100 girls from 5 schools, is the largest in the forum's history.

"These young women are our future, and if we as their local leaders don't invest in them, who will?" said Reynolds. "Hosting this event is by far one of my favorite days of the year, and many of the mentors and mentees from the event have made connections that they will mutually benefit from well past today."

While connection opportunities will continue for all of the young women in attendance, two girls from each school are recipients of scholarships that will allow them to attend the 22nd Annual Enterprising Women of the Year Awards Celebration & Conference that will be held in Orlando, Florida, April 7-9.


